

Launcher

The launcher is made of anodized aluminum. It has 5 positions of launch and can be easily used for the study of the parabolic motion.



Removable pendulum

Removable pendulum allows to determine its mass and center of mass.




Aluminum T-shape holder

With an accuracy of 1°, the graduated scale is screenprinted on an aluminum plate for a simple and quick measurement reading.




EXPERIMENT DESCRIPTION

A steel projectile having mass m and speed v is fired horizontally into the PVC pendulum swinging block which is initially stationary and whose mass M is far greater than the projectile's one.

The speed of the projectile can be calculated thanks to the law of conservation of angular momentum, neglecting the effect of any external or frictional forces.

The launching system is removable and suitable to verify the initial speed of a projectile according to the laws of parabolic motion; this allows to compare the result with that one obtained by performing the inelastic collision experience.
